Mission

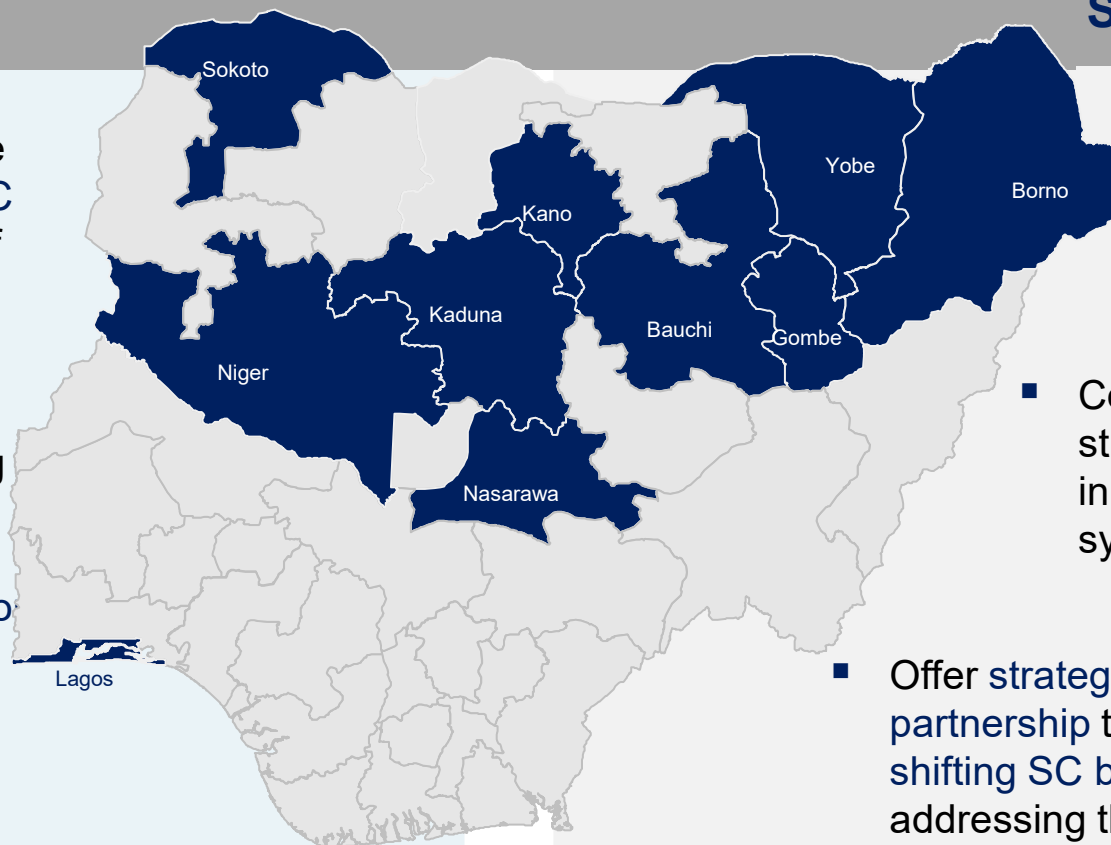
To be the leading resource platform to the Federal and State Governments in Nigeria, providing access to supply chain expertise, financing, and solutions to improve public health.

CONTEXT

- A concerted focus to improve the performance of states' **PHC system** is key to the delivery of high quality, affordable, and accessible PHC services
- There are many issues driving **underperformance** across various elements of the PHC system in Nigeria. including **poor health system design**, **poor governance** and system fragmentation.
- One of building blocks of the Foundation's approach to strengthening PHC **improved supply chain (SC) system performance**



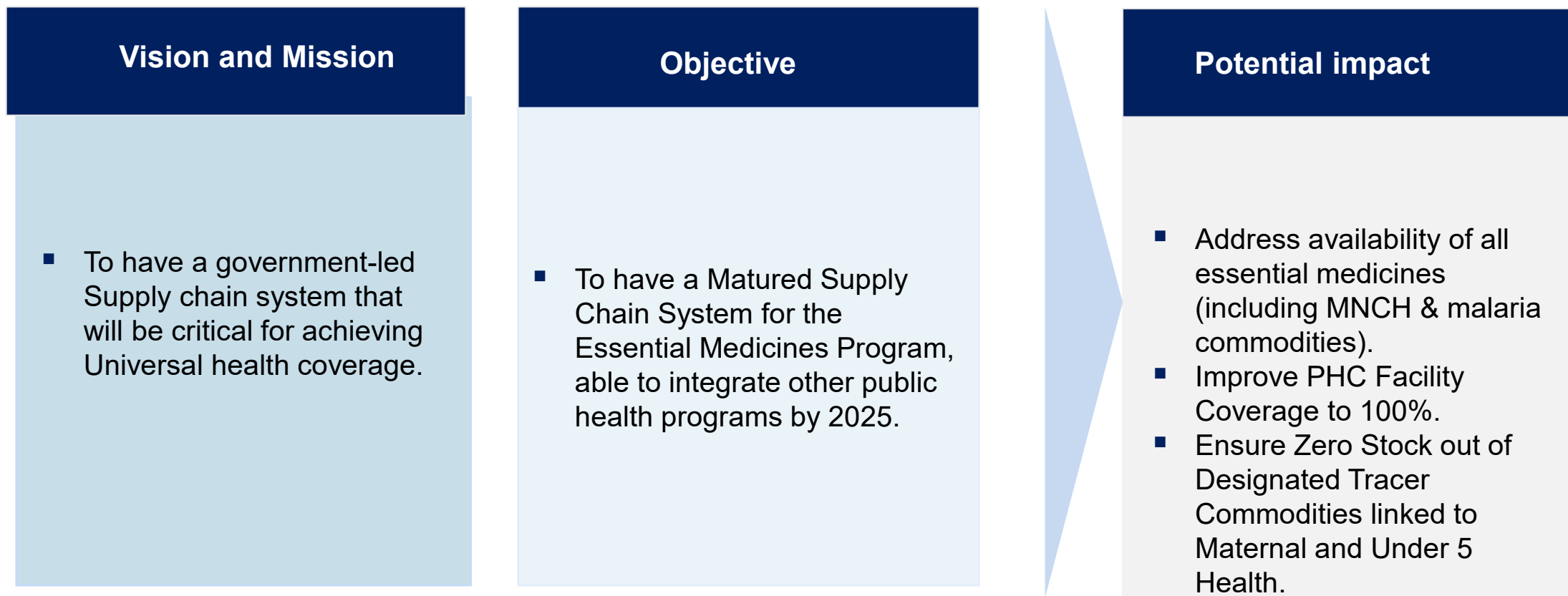
SCOPE OF INVESTMENT

The Investment targets

- Enable improvements in Supply Chain (SC) performance for up to **10 BMGF priority states**
- Contribute to **Africa Team's SP 2.2** to strengthen **institutional capacity** to innovate and continuously improve systems for service delivery
- Offer **strategic thought leadership and partnership** to states to identify constantly **shifting SC bottlenecks** and solutions to addressing the bottlenecks
- **Broker** regional, national and local collaborative partnerships with private sector and other BMGF grantees to support the implementation of prioritized interventions.

PPP Project Impact

Increased Access to Quality and Affordable healthcare commodities through an Innovative PPP

Objective

- To increase access to quality and affordable medicines across States.
- Ensure the PPP strengthens Local Manufacturing capacity in Nigeria's Pharma Industry

State Impact

- Supported States to adopt a business model leveraging the strength of the instituted **Drug Management Agencies** (DMAs) to engage private companies through an innovative partnership approach known as the **Marriage PPP**.
- The Marriage PPP has created rapid **access** to a wide range of **essential medicines** including at negotiated discounted prices across States.
- State government investment for medicines through the PPP within 48 months is about– **\$3 million across 6 States**.
- States leading in financing their supply chains with an **investment plan of 40% (public funds); 40% (private corporate social responsibility); 20% (donor co-investment)**.

Pharma Impact

- States procuring from local manufacturers of Pharmaceuticals, a wide range of SKUs way beyond the National Essential Medicines List: **Impacting local pharma business in Nigeria**.
- Local pharma companies **expanding manufacturing capacity** in line with the Universal Health Coverage mandate of the country **creating public health impact**.
- **Increased donor interest** in strengthening local pharmaceutical manufacturing in Nigeria. Donors such as BMGF, USAID, TGF increasing investments in the area of manufacturing expansion and quality assurance.
